

August 5th, 2025 - King County Primary Election

On August 5th, King County voters will vote on **King County Proposition No. 1 – Parks, Recreation, Trails, and Open Space Levy**. The levy would replace the current levy expiring at the end of 2025 and generate \$1.45 Billion over six years (2026 – 2031). The average cost for a homeowner is **\$16.38 PER MONTH**. The levy funds more than 250 parks, playfields, **swimming pools**, and hands-on learning destinations, in every city and across rural King County.

A \$46 MILLION AQUATICS FACILITY GRANT PROGRAM is included which is \$10 million increase from the existing (and inaugural) Aquatic Facilities Grant Program. The program funds grants for **planning and capital needs for new and existing PUBLIC aquatic facilities**. Grants are up to \$5 million for capital and up to \$100,000 for planning/feasibility studies.


